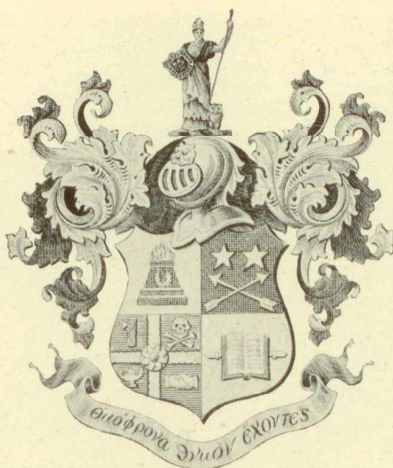




THETA DELTA CHI

Theta Deuteron Charge of Theta Delta Chi was established on March 21, 1890. In a meeting held at the Tremont House, the following men were initiated as charter members: William C. Capron, Frank H. Dorr, George B. Hawley, J. Francis White, Thomas H. Creden, Horace H. Ensworth, Francis C. Norton, and Clarence E. Whitney. Conditions proved unfavorable for the maintenance of the charge at that time, chiefly because of the lack of a fraternity house; consequently the charter was surrendered in October, 1892.

In 1903 a group of Tech students who desired to have the old charge reestablished formed a local fraternity known as Alpha Epsilon, with a house on St. Botolph Street. The organization subsequently moved into quarters on Gloucester Street, and still later at 262 Newbury Street. This society petitioned Theta Delta Chi in 1905 and again in 1906 for readmission as Theta Deuteron Charge. In June of the latter year the charter was granted, and the members of Alpha Epsilon were initiated as a body into Theta Delta Chi.

The year 1909 saw the first Theta Delta Chi Convention to take place in Boston after the reestablishment of the charge. It was held February 20-22, in Lorimer Hall. Headquarters for the delegates was at Tremont Temple, and the Convention Banquet occurred at Hotel Somerset. About 1910 the charge moved again, this time to 80 Bay State Road. It stayed at this address until 1916, when another transfer was made, with 334 Harvard Street, Cambridge, as the new location. In February of the same year another Convention of Theta Delta Chi was held in Boston, with the Copley-Plaza Hotel as the scene of operations.

By 1925 it was realized that the house on Harvard Street was inadequate, and plans were made to buy a new house within a few years. In 1930 these plans materialized, and the charge moved into its present quarters at 314 Memorial Drive.

Theta Deuteron Charge has had a number of members who, as alumni, have achieved more than average degree of success. In mentioning a few of these one might note Prof. Erwin H. Schell, the head of the Business Administration Department of the Institute, and Prof. Karl D. Fernstrom, also of the Department. There are others, too numerous to mention, who have become successful in business.
